Dr. Ulisses Pereira earned his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 2006 from the Federal University of Lavras (Brazil), where he also completed his M.Sc. (2008) and Ph.D. (2013) in Veterinary Sciences. He has been an Associate Professor in State University of Londrina Brazil since 2015. He is an elected Affiliate Member of the Brazilian Academy of Sciences and currently serves as Director for Latin America and the Caribbean on the Executive Board of the World Aquatic Veterinary Medical Association. He is also an active member of the Brazilian Association of Aquatic Animal Pathologists (ABRAPOA), the Collaborative Commission on Antimicrobial Resistance (COC-RAM), and one of the vice-coordinators of the Omic Sciences Network (RECOM). Dr. Pereira is a member of the State Commission for the Health of Aquatic Organisms in partnership with ADAPAR. As a researcher and graduate advisor in the Animal Science Program, his work focuses on fish diseases, with expertise in microbiological and molecular diagnosis, antimicrobial resistance, pathogenesis, vaccine development, and the genetic diversity and genomics/bioinformatics of pathogenic bacteria.
