Externships Available

MSU CVM is pleased to offer externships for veterinary students and veterinary technician students covering a wide range of topics in aquatic animal health.

- Catfish is the largest foodfish aquaculture sector in the U.S. and Mississippi is the largest producer of catfish in the U.S. MSU CVM has two aquatic diagnostic and research laboratories which support this industry. One is housed on the Starkville campus and the other is housed at the Thad Cochran National Warmwater Aquaculture Center in Stoneville, Mississippi.
- MSU CVM collaborates with the Institute of Marine Mammal Studies (IMMS) in Gulfport, MS. We have faculty members based in Gulfport managing the health of endangered sea turtles, dolphins, and other marine animals.
- MSU CVM houses the USAID funded Feed the Future Innovation Lab for Fish. This lab aims to alleviate poverty and improve nutrition in vulnerable populations through reliable and inclusive provision of fish in the diets of developing nations. Activities in this lab include both aquaculture and fisheries.

Extern Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the extern will be identified prior to the start of the externship. Responsibilities and expectations will vary depending on the interests of the extern and the specific program. For most externships, transportation and housing are not provided. All externs are required to adhere to MSU CVM policies.

Application Process

Applications are accepted year-round. Positions fill quickly and often 1 year in advance; early application is strongly encouraged. The application process is unique to each opportunity, please contact the appropriate person below for application instructions.
